Executive Summary


The CIA conducts a Campus Climate Survey in the fall of every year. The 2018 Campus Climate Survey was conducted in November 2018. The survey assesses the climate and culture of all domestic campus locations (NY, CA, and TX).

2026 students were invited to take part in the survey. 415 students responded to the survey with an overall response rate of 20.5%: 327 (NY), 40 (CA), 27 (TX), and 21 (unknown location).

□ 68.8% (285) were between the age of 18-21; 14.5% (60) were between the age of 22-25; 8.5% (35) were between the age of 26-30
□ 78% (322) were residential students; 22% (91) were commuter students
□ 54.5% were enrolled in an Associate's degree (21.7% Baking and Pastry Arts & 32.8% Culinary Arts); 39.4% were enrolled in a Bachelor's degree
□ 59.3% (246) identified as female; 35.7% (148) identified as male; 1.9% (8) identified as transgender or other
□ 74.5% (309) identified as heterosexual; 9.2% (38) identified as bisexual; 6.0% (25) identified as homosexual
